

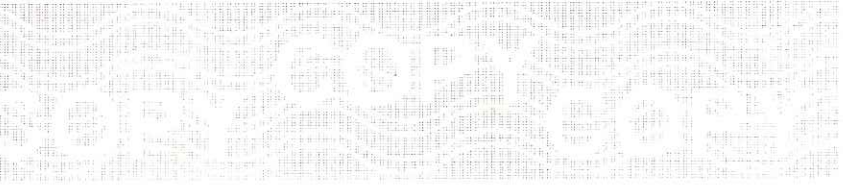
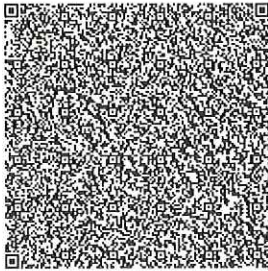

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

School of Social Work, Roshni Nilaya, Mangalore, Karnataka
and
Tata Institute of Social Sciences, Mumbai

The Memorandum of Understanding between Tata Institute of Social Sciences (TISS), Mumbai and School of Social Work (SSR), Roshni Nilaya, Mangalore sets out the terms and conditions to cooperate on projects mutually agreed upon by both parties in line with values and objectives to encourage academic cooperation through academic collaboration in furtherance of learning in the areas of social science in general and social entrepreneurship in specific.

1. Background- Centre for Social Entrepreneurship, TISS

TISS being the first social science deemed universities under the UGC Act, 1956 of the Government of India, has 80 years of experience in teaching, research and outreach engagement in the areas of rural and community development and social change through entrepreneurial actions. Ranked highest among the Deemed Universities in the country, TISS plays critical role in policy design, advocacy and action in various aspects of social welfare and rural development.

The Centre for Social Entrepreneurship from the School of Management and Labour Studies, TISS, Mumbai not only offers the unique Masters Programme on Social Entrepreneurship but also offers services in social venture creation for bringing social change. The Centre for Social Entrepreneurship shares its experiences with UN agencies (UNESCO and UNCTAD), British Council and the Russian Federation (and Nepal in the pipeline) to create wider global impact.

Incubation Centre, supported by University Grants Commission (UGC, Govt of India), has been set up to support social start-ups committed to create social impact. The Centre has designed unique processes and systems for selection, mentoring, seed funding, monitoring and review of social start-ups. So far the Centre has supported 37 social ventures working at various parts of the country. Many have won international awards and have successfully scaled up to receive formal venture investment.

2. Background for School of Social Work, RoshniNilaya, Mangalore, Karnataka

The School of Social Work, managed by the Institute of Social Service Mangalore of Karnataka State, was established in 1960 in Mangalore. It is the pioneer Post Graduate Centre for Social Work Education in Karnataka, listed as a 'Minority' Institution. It is situated on a six acre campus wherein, besides the college, there are service centres such as Kindergarten, Family Service Agency, Family Counseling Centre and CHILDLINE.

3. Purpose of the MoU

The purpose of the MoU between TISS and SSR is to agree to collaborate in areas that will be mutually beneficial to both parties as outlined in Section 6 of this MoU.

4. Reporting Structure

The parties agree that they will abide by the reporting structures of both the institutions as the need arises.

5. Duration and Termination of the MoU

- a. The memorandum commences on the date of the last signature by the parties and will operate until the termination as per (5.b) below



- b. This memorandum is valid for a period of three (3) years and terminates on the occurrence at any of the following events:
- i) Cancellation by mutual agreement of the parties to this memorandum;
 - ii) Cancellation by either of the parties to this memorandum on thirty (30) days written notice to the other;
 - iii) Cancellation by either of the parties to this memorandum in terms of clause for breach of the memorandum by the other party; and
 - iv) If the purpose of the MoU becomes obsolete

6. Areas of Collaboration as per this MoU

The parties agree that the areas listed below will form the basis of the MoU between the two parties:

- a. TISS and SSR will participate and support joint research projects, training programs and workshops and conferences for the UG and PG students, research scholars and faculty members, as per the rules prescribed by the respective institution/university.
- b. TISS will provide to SSR the required technical guidance on social entrepreneurship and related subjects. The subjects and scope will be mutually agreed.
- c. The cost associated with any such activities will be borne by School of Social Work, RoshniNilaya. There will be no cost to TISS related to any such activities.

7. Breach

- a. If either party to this memorandum defaults by breaching any of its provisions, the aggrieved party may serve a notice on the defaulting party, detailing the nature and extent of the default, the steps that ought to be taken by the defaulting party to rectify the breach or failure, and the time period (which must be reasonable and must not be less than 10 days) within which the breach must be rectified.
- b. If the defaulting party fails to comply with the terms of the notice referred to in the above clause, the aggrieved party, without prejudice to any other remedy it may have, cancel this memorandum upon thirty (30) days written notice to the defaulting party.

8. Resolution of Disputes



- a. The parties to this memorandum must participate fully in the process of resolution and mediation of the dispute
- b. If mediation fails to resolve the dispute within the agreed upon period the dispute may be referred by either party for arbitration.
- c. The cost borne in respect of the services performed by the mediator and the arbitrator (and ancillary costs) must be born equally between the parties, unless otherwise agreed between the parties or otherwise ordered by the arbitrator.
